This certificate is to be completed and carried by the driver of a vehicle or vehicle configuration fitted with triaxle groups if the vehicle is accredited outside South Australia under the Mass Management Module of the National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Scheme, and is being driven in South Australia at Higher Mass Limits.

Prior to travelling on roads in South Australia, the route to be traversed must be determined from the maps referred to in the South Australian Gazette Notice appropriate to the configuration in which the vehicle or combination is operating.

Drivers must comply with the conditions of operation of the appropriate Gazette Notice and also carry a copy of the Notice and any required documents in the vehicle when operating in South Australia. This Certificate must be produced to a DTEI Authorised Officer or Police Officer on request.
